Introduction: The introduction must contain a brief statement of the question, hypothesis, or objective. Please remember the interdisciplinary nature of NCTERM's membership when writing your abstract. The opening paragraph should be understandable and of interest to both specialist and non-specialist alike.

Materials and Methods: Methods, including statistical techniques; human experiments should note approval of an institutional review board (IRB) and informed consent and animal experiments should note approval of an IRB conforming to the laws and regulations of the country of origin.

Results and Discussion: Present essential results, including data, sample size and statistics. Discuss results including limitations within the framework of stated question, hypothesis, or objective.

One Figure or Table (optional)

Figure 1: Here, a minimum of 9 point Times New Roman font can be used to explain all panels of the figure.

Conclusions: Should summarize significance of results within the frame work of stated question, hypothesis or objective. Future studies may be included.

Acknowledgements: Support and personnel.

References: References are optional and should be written in a minimum of 9 point Times New Roman font.

Abbreviations: Standard abbreviations may be used for common terms. For uncommon terms, the abbreviations should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word.

NOTE: The text of the abstract (not including authors, institutions/affiliations and titles) must be typed single-spaced with 11 point, Times New Roman font and limited to **300 words**.
